Ted Hummel's Uncle

Ted's uncle William Hellstern was a Gunners Mate 2nd Class on the USS Oklahoma, a Nevada-class battleship that was sunk by several torpedoes during the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, December 7th, 1941. Five and a half years ago the Navy contacted Ted and said they were trying to identify remains and asked for samples of Ted's and his mother's DNA. Ted's mother passed away some years ago, but it just so happened that he had a locket of her hair that he could send to them along with a swap of his own DNA.

They called him several months ago and said they had identified his uncle's remains and they will be doing a full military funeral at 11 am at Mt. Olivet Friday, May 18th. As Ted does not have much family, just him and his son, it would be great if we could have a great representation from the Jaguar club at the funeral. June 30th, 35th Annual Colorado Concours d'Elegance & Exotic Sports Car Show - Vince Lane

The month of May is approaching and it is time for us all to start thinking seriously about the 2018 Colorado Concours. This year's date is Sunday June 10th, and will be the 35th rendition of this great event which, as always, will take place on the lawn at Arapahoe Community College, 5900 S. Santa Fe Drive in Littleton. Sponsored by Ability Connection Colorado (ACCO) this year's concours will benefit at-risk children through ACCO's Creative Options for Early Childhood Education Program.

As many of you know ACCO is RMJC's designated charity and our club was one of the very early sponsors of this event. Last year's show honored Jaguar as the featured Marque and paid tribute to our club's 50th anniversary. Some 40 Jaguars were in attendance highlighted by Jeff Schroeder's amazing C and D-Types and Dave Massy's spectacular Cotswold Blue XK 150 that garnered the Concours' coveted People's Choice Award.



You can register on line at the ACCO website or at www.coloradoconcours.org. The last date to register and have your car included in the program is Wednesday May 16th. On line registration closes Wednesday May 23rd which is also the cut-off date for signing up to have your car Concours judged. After May 23rd you can download the registration form and take it to ACCO (June 6-8) or bring it the morning of the show assuming space is available. This year's entry fee is \$50.00 (\$100.00 if you want your car Concours judged). We will have our usual club judging and ACCO will provide 1st and Place ribbons for our regular six classes plus a special "Judges Choice" ribbon.

Last year's event netted ACCO \$101,498.00. This year's featured Marque is Porsche and they are promising some very special cars. When you go on line to register be sure to mark RMJC as your club affiliation. You might also want to check out ACCO's Porsche Cayman raffle. In conjunction with all their fundraising events in 2018, ACCO is selling chances to win a 2019 Porsche Cayman GTS (or \$75,000.00). The drawing will be held December 15th and you don't have to be present to win.

As always I could use 3 or 4 volunteers to help stake out the grounds at the college on Saturday the 9th. Please let me know if you can help. We can also use a couple volunteers on Sunday morning to park cars and direct traffic. Minutes of Board Meeting of April 3rd by Bill Beeson

Treasurer's Report:

Deanie reported that the financial status of the club remains very good. The majority of Cat Tales advertisers have renewed for 2018. Club membership is at 100 with several more renewals expected. The Club is on budget. Deanie, as the Club **Webmaster**, also commented on ongoing improvements to the website content.

Event Recap: The Annual General Meeting (AGM) of JCNA held in March was attended by Deanie and Steve Kennedy and Bob Grossman. This year's meeting was held in San Antonio, TX. Highlights from the meeting were presented by the attendees. This included a rundown of new rules for Concours Judging and a recently released, very extensive, XK 120 Judging Guide. One new rule that drew some controversy at AGM was one requiring Judges to evaluate the cleanliness of the items that can be seen through wire wheels and alloys on all models, like brake calipers, rotors, and inner wheels, but not for authenticity.



The Presidents Dinner was also recapped with the consensus being that it was a very enjoyable and successful gathering. We enjoyed great conversations at each table, good food and drinks, and a thought provoking video presentation on the future of Jaguar electric cars, both new and classics.



Upcoming Events: Don Leach, our representative to the Colorado Classic Car Council (CCCC) reported on the decision of the CCCC to support the Rocky Mountain Airport Airplane and Car Show this year. This is a departure from CCCC supporting the War Birds Car Show held at Front Range Airport as they have in the past. As a member club of the CCCC, RMJC will support the Rocky Mountain Airport Show.

It was reported by Deanie that the RMJC Concours d'Elegance originally scheduled at the "Spirit of Flight" Museum is to be relocated due to a scheduling conflict at the museum. Details are in this issue of Cat Tales.

Vince reported on the ACC show and reminded us that volunteers are requested for set up the day before and the morning of show to help direct the cars onto the field.

Gary also reported on the British Car Conclave and our long time commitment to this popular show. Hagerty Insurance has increased their commitment to the show this year.


Alans second event was the the Scottish Highland Games, which has returned to the Denver area from Snowmass.

Report of the Judges School of April 21st by Steve Kennedy

Despite Steve getting the dates mixed up, seven Judges showed up for Gary's class, Dwight Eishach, Ray Horral, Bill Beeson, Jon Strader, Tom Cohen, Rick Hill and Steve Kennedy. Gary went over the 2018 updates and reviewed many of the items he thought were important.

The biggest change for 2018 is on wheels. The inside of the wheels are now judged for cleanliness and condition. If you can see it, it needs to be clean. That does not mean to judge for authenticity for something like the brake drums on XK 120s; are they red or black. That still does not matter, they just need to be clean. However, if they are rusty, that falls under the Condition deduction, they can be any color, but rust is not a color, it's a condition.

On the other hand, do not judge the suspension for on E-Types for anything. That item was brought up and the decision was to pass on suspension all together.

Thanks to Hagerty for hosting the Judge's School and buying lunch. Jeff Shroder had offered to buy lunch but Hagerty insisted.



