
This is a very special happening for this long-standing annual event hosted by the MG club.

As usual, it includes drives, rally, a banquet and a car show on the banks of the Colorado River.





Good of the Order – No new topics


Steve was able to move the meeting along at a good clip and the meeting was adjourned at 8:45pm.



Electric Car "fuel" costs

If you are considering owning one of the new Jaguar I-Paces (or some other EV) then you probably are planning on having low "fuel" costs. And you won't be disappointed.

Home Charging: Most EV's go about 3 miles on one kilo-watthour (kWhr) of electricity. Typical costs for electricity is 11 cents per kWhr and at that rate it will cost about 4 cents per mile for electricity. A similar size gasoline powered car at 25 mpg and \$2.50/gallon will be 10 cents per mile for fuel. Save 6 cents per mile for 10,000 miles a year and pocket \$600. A nice benefit but it won't put you on easy street.

Commercial Chargers: Costs vary considerably but will probably be at least twice as much as home charging.

But you probably will enjoy the EV driving experience, delightful acceleration, one-pedal driving, skipping gasoline stations and oil-changes, and knowing that the air will be a bit cleaner for the next generation.
