Presidents May Letter by Steve Kennedy



At the time of this writing, we are all looking out at snow. Hopefully by the time you read this it will be more like summer.

Bill and Gordon certainly hosted a spectacular Spring Dust-Off. They even arranged for fantastic weather and the trip in the Colorado Mountains

was just perfect. When we got near Woodland Park, we got to see a view of the north side of Pikes Peak that we don't usually see.

The Rocky Mtn. Airport Air and Ground Show and Swap Meet will be August 3rd. It would be great if we could have a good club turnout for this event.

A quick update on the Judges School. Gary went over chapters 5 and 6. He had gone over most of the others at the last Judges School.



A few of the items he went over were: A single item/component, judged to have more than one non-authentic issue, such as both wrong configuration and finish, should only be given a single non-authentic deduction. However, the point deduction given should be the one with the highest point value associated with the non-authenticity issues observed.

Exterior rear view mirrors must be (1) factory installed or factory optional equipment, (2) sourced through an official Jaguar/SS/Swallow parts supplier, or (3) be of a style/configuration appropriate to the vintage of the model and (4), all mounting hardware and fasteners must be consistent with the vintage and Jaguar standards. Mirror location is not specified.

Tire valve stems should have valve stem caps appropriate to the vintage. Pre-'55 Jaguar tire valve stems should have cad-plated, dome-type metal valve stem caps. Regarding valve stem caps, until proven otherwise or by newly discovered evidence, 1955 to 1962 will be treated as a transitional period for Jaguars and either domed metal or domed black plastic valve stem caps will be treated as authentic. All four valve stem caps on the road wheels plus the valve stem cap on the spare tire must match. Slotted metal valve stem caps, with the core removal extension, are non-authentic. (A separate core removal tool is included in the factory tool kit.) 1963 and onward models should have dometype black plastic valve stem caps. Logo valve stem caps must be shown to have been an authentic Jaguar Cars accessory for the specific year and model they are presented on. Greencolored valve stem caps, indicating the use of nitrogen gas, are not an authorized Jaguar accessory and, therefore, are non-authentic. The type of gas in the tire is not a judging issue.

This evening's program: "Appraisal on Your Own" – Gary George



Gary presented an excellent case for vehicle appraisals, focusing on ways that each owner can start their own appraisal for insurance purposes. Several tools that should be used were described, including "Old Cars Report Price Guide", "Hagerty's Price Guide", and "Hemmings Motoring News". Owners should pay particular attention to the rating of cars from Museum – Quality down to Parts Car in each guide and remember that all guides are three or more months old when they are published. There are many Online sources also available for pricing information.

When buying a collector car, Gary reminded us that "Matching numbers" is a myth. Watch out for restorations with "matching numbers". Very few manufacturers before 1968 stamped and recorded numbers for engine, transmission, and rear differential. The matching numbers sales pitch is a ploy and not necessarily accurate. Gary does not review cars for matching numbers.

The key is to properly appraise the value of your vehicle and insure its "agreed value" at this appraised value or more. Gary had many examples of owners not receiving the true value of their car after an incident from insurance companies that valued the collector cars at used typical car values.

Gary advised that owners should appraise every vehicle every three to five years.





What will it cost to drive an Electric Vehicle (EV)?

based on my 6 years experience - Gordon K.

In the last few days my wife and I have been asked that question by three different people. This type of question indicates that many people are aware that electric vehicles (EV's) are becoming more available, more affordable, more practical and thus more desirable.

It's useful to note that "Internal Com-

bustion Engines" (ICE's) vehicles are typically driven until the fuel tank is near empty and then the tank is fully filled; for many people this refueling can be done once a week.

But an EV is typically recharged frequently as it is desirable to keep the vehicle range near the maximum since convenient and quick recharge facilities are not always available. Many owners plug-in their EV's every night to allow the next day's driving to start with a full range.

One way to answer the "cost to recharge an EV" and to compare it to an ICE vehicle is to consider the cost to drive 100 miles. ICE vehicles vary widely in their efficiency (miles per gallon or mpg) with many larger vehicles such as SUV's and PU's getting 15 mpg while smaller and lighter vehicles can get 30 mpg or more in urban driving. For comparison purposes an example of a 20 mpg vehicle driven 100 miles and using 5 gallons of gasoline at a cost of \$3.00 per gallon gives a cost of \$15.00 for 100 miles driven or 15 cents per mile. The cost of fuel is about the same regardless of where it is purchased.



EV's vary much less in efficiency and most will travel about 3 miles on one kilo-watt hour (kWhr) of electricity. Most EV charging is done overnight at home which is supplemented as needed by commercial recharging facilities. Home electricity costs vary by region but typical local rates from IREA or

Xcel are 10 to 15 cents per kWhr. For this comparison and using 12 cents per kWhr and 3 miles per kWhr gives a cost of 4 cents per mile or \$4.00 per 100 miles driven.

Thus in this comparison the cost of a 100 mile drive in an EV is \$4.00 while the corresponding cost in an ICE is \$15.00. Said another way it's 15 cents/mile for gasoline and 4 cents/mile for electric. **The EV cost is about 1/3 that of an ICE vehicle**.

There are many exceptions to this simple comparison. In my personal situation the electricity is produced by solar PV panels at no cost and free recharging stations are provided by the vehicle manufacturer.

But not all EV owners will have convenient home chargers available and they may regularly use commercial chargers and be paying 20, 30 or even 40 cents per kWhr.

As is often the case in our complex world, the best way forward is to learn the facts and apply them to your own situation.

Another long road trip completed in our EV as we recently drove to southern lowa to my sisters funeral. It was 32 degrees when we left at noon and we drove in wind and snow until well east of Limon. But we arrived at Corydon, IA about 5 pm the next day in great weather. This trip is 755 miles one way and we used the Tesla Superchargers for all of the trip. Coming back we left at 8 am, recharged at Bethany, Mo, then in Kansas at Topeka, Hays, and in Goodland. We also charged a few minutes in Limon although we didn't really need to but wanted a bathroom break. For the whole trip we used about 525 kWhr which at 12 cents per kWhr would cost \$64 for the 1,600 miles driven. Gordon K.

This 1968 Series 1.5 E-type was purchased locally by the present owner in 1996. It was owned by Coloradans for at least 8 years before then, judging by the dates and locations on trophies that came with it. This E-type was originally delivered to

a San Diego resident and now has 56,800 miles on the odometer. It is highly original with matching numbers for engine, transmission and body, and original exterior and interior colors, according to the Jaguar-Daimler Heritage Trust Certificate. Even the radio is original (Blaupunkt AM/FM/SW) and, surprisingly, still works. The car also sports a complete, authentic Series I tool set as well as original jack assembly.

The car has not been restored, but it has been refurbished over the past several years including new paint over primed bare metal, replacement of much of the interior trim, and a new top. The tires are new Vredsteins, generally agreed to be the best driving ones available for an E-type.

Over the past 20 years the brake master cylinder and vacuum booster have been replaced as have the clutch master and slave cylinders. A new clutch was recently installed as well.



Minutes of May 1 2019 meeting

Legislative: Leo Boyle provided his overview of the legislative session that is concluding this week. The status of various bills are listed below:

HB19-1067: Concerning a requirement that motor vehicle windows transmit a minimum level of light.

HB19-1138: Concerning vehicle transfer registration fee credit. *Probably will pass.*

HB19-1159: Modifications to the income tax credits for innovative motor vehicles. *Awaiting second reading.*

HB19-1198: Concerning the powers and duties of the electric vehicle grant fund. *Passed.*

HB19-1207: Requiring motor vehicles to meet traction-control standards for winter conditions. *Expect to pass.*

HB19-1261: Setting Greenhouse Gas pollution goals. *Expected to pass.* HB19-1286: Limiting the number of people who may sell vehicles to dealers under a wholesalers license. *Passed*

HB19-1298: Concerning use of electric vehicle charging stations for parking vehicles. *Just introduced, Probably not enough time for hearings.*

HB19-1300: VIN inspections performed by certified peace officer.

Passed.HB19-1313: Reduce CO2 emissions by public utilities. *Expected to pass.*
