

Report on the Mecum Auction - July 12-13th by Gordon K.

Bill Beeson, his friend Jim Lewien and I attended the Friday auction at the Denver Convention Center. The following list is the sales results obtained from their web site. There were 358 cars sold for a total of \$10.2 million.

Observations: The 1993 XJS was a beautifully presented car that sold strong. The 1967 Jaguar 420 RHD was in good condition and had a lot of bidder interest.; we talked with a lady from MO who was photographing it before it sold and she said her husband really wanted one. The 2006 XK8 was a beautiful convertible with only 35k miles and looked new but it was one of 3 XK8's that didn't get bids to meet reserve. It was not a good venue for those Jaguars.

Buying your first Electric Vehicle (EV) by Gordon K.

Selecting your 1st electric car can be a difficult process and I recommend shopping from a short list of models (Leafs, Bolts, Jaguar I-Pace and Teslas) as detailed on the next page. These cover the complete price and performance range, are readily available and have track records.

What is the intended use of the car (how much range do I need)? Is it going to be the ONLY car or will it be used only for daily transportation for work, school or shopping. EV's with ranges of 150 to 200 miles are best suited for in-town daily needs but long distance driving will benefit from longer ranges and 300+ range is useful.

How much money to spend? New or used EV's are available from \$10,000 to over \$100,000. Most <u>new EV</u>'s qualify for the Federal Tax Credit (can be up to \$7,500) and for the Colorado Alternative fuel incentive of \$5,000 but used EV's do not qualify for either.

Charge your EV? All EV's can use "Level 1" chargers (110 volt) which can provide 50 miles of range per day. Most EV's can use "Level 2" (240 volt) chargers which is the best setup for daily use and can provide hundreds of miles of range charging overnight. But long distance driving needs "DC" (direct current) charging capability with rating of at least 50 kW (kilowatts) and preferably 100 kW or more. Not all EV's can accept DC charging.

Range Extended EV's, like the discontinued Chev Volt, are excellent used EV buys. You get the EV driving experience but have a gas powered generator if needed so you never experience "range anxiety". Used 1st and 2nd generation Volts and Nisson Leafs are available at Carmax and at the Green Eyed Motors in Boulder.

How and Where to for shop for an EV:

Both New and Used Nisson "**Leafs**" and Chevrolet "**Bolts**" are at dealers. Prices start around \$30k and go up to \$45k. Desirable upgrades include larger batteries and improved charging capability. Go to the dealer, look at what is available and how they are priced and then DO THE TEST DRIVE.

The **Jaguar I-Pace** is in the upper price bracket (\$70k to \$90k) and used ones may be available. Go to the dealerships and look and learn and DO THE TEST DRIVE. Ask about charging.

Teslas can be seen at showrooms and test drives arranged at the Cherry Creek Shopping Center (303-200-4240, ext.3).or at the Park Meadows Mall (303-792-3450) where you can also see a Supercharger station in use. Go to a showroom and TAKE ONE OR MORE TEST DRIVES. The Model 3 starts at \$39,000 and the Model S and X start at \$80,000 new. Used ones of each model are available with many at half price or less. Purchasing, new or used, is done on-line; sign on to Tesla.com, in upper RH corner go to "find us", then to "store". Explore New or Used Inventory, enter the "buy" process and go through the program to see how it works. Also learn about the hundreds of Supercharger station along the highways of the US which greatly facilitates cross-country travel.

Last winter I took a test drive in a new Model S. Then using the Tesla.com program I searched used inventory, selected a 2015 Model S, asked for more detail, decided to buy, made a deposit and bought the car. I didn't talk to anybody during this whole process until the day of delivery. The process worked beautifully

I invite you to drive it (carefully). Gordon K.

These EV's models have been sold for at least a year and are in stock at dealers; used models are usually available. They are an excellent group from which to obtain ones first EV. Many other EV's are now available but the group above includes most that are being bought and driven now.

The MSRP listed is for the basic car but popular options can increase the cost from \$500 up to \$20,000. The Leaf and Bolt are very likely to be discounted by the dealer and used models may be available at about half of new cost. New EV's are eligible for the Colorado \$5,000 incentive and Federal Tax credits from \$1,875 to \$7,500.

The Jaguar I-Pace is new to the market and sells in small numbers in the U.S. but it's being very well received worldwide. It has collected many accolades and International recognition and gets great driving reviews. It has the Jaguar style, is very nicely finished and has good range and charging ability; it would be a great "first" EV.

Tesla Related Notes: More than half of the EV's sold are Teslas and the Model 3's, the Model S and the Model X set the "standard" for new EV's.

One reason the Tesla Model 3 dominates the EV market includes its price which starts at less than \$39k and provides good range with many having ranges of more than 300 miles. All have fast acceleration and high performance models are available. Every Tesla includes "autopilot" driving aids and full self-driving capability is an option. All are Internet connected and receive frequent no-cost upgrades

Unique to Tesla is 24/7 access to the hundreds of "Supercharger" stations along the interstate highways. All are high rate DC chargers and some now provide 75 miles of range charge in 5 minutes. The vehicle warranty, both new and used, is comprehensive and includes roadside service anywhere in the US. When service is needed most likely it will be provided by "mobile service" where they come to your home or business and do the work. When introduced in 2012 the car received Motor Trend's "Car of the Year" award and just this year they named the 2013 Model S the most "transformative" car of the last 70 years. NHTSA gives them the highest safety rating of any car manufactured.

Keep these parameters in mind when buying your very first EV.

Dealing with Tesla is different than with conventional auto dealers. There are few "new" cars on display and all purchasing, new or used, is done on-line using a very simple program. But the popularity of the cars is reflective of the value of the cars. They sell well because they are good.

Minutes of Meeting, 3 July 2019




The meeting was called to order at 7:37 pm by President Dick Thompson at the ColoRODans clubhouse, 209 Kimbark St., in Longmont CO. Officers in attendance were Dick Thompson, president; Samantha Baker, 2nd VP; Dick Fritz, secretary, and Tom Kay, treasurer. 18 member clubs plus one individual member were signed in. Dick thanked the ColoRODans, specifically

Air & Ground Show and Swap Meet, August 3. Dick Thompson reported on progress and plans for the Airport Show; the number of aircraft displays is growing steadily. Aircraft from both WWII and WWII will be there. For the swap meet 100 spaces will be marked off.
