





## Report from the CCCC meeting of Dec. 4th by Dick Thompson



**Legislative:** Leo Boyle noted that the Colorado Legislature will resume in January with administrative actions such as forming committees and selecting chairpersonships; by February we should see bills that are being proposed. He expects that there will be action on updating the myriad license plates in Colorado and we should watch for changes in plates used by collector vehicles.

**Freedom To Drive (FTD):** John Mack led a discussion regarding the FTD organization described by the guest speaker, Matthew Groves, at the November meeting. The FTD coalition came about in response to the regulatory and municipality actions to restrict use of privately owned internal combustion engine vehicles in Colorado. Such actions have included the adoption of California's LEV and ZEV standards, eliminating vehicle lanes in downtown areas, and eliminating parking spaces. It was debated how involved the CCCC should become, and Leo Boyle cautioned that this could become a political issue and we cannot afford to antagonize legislators. John questioned if SEMA is aware of FTD's statement of purpose (apparently not yet). The CCCC has been invited to endorse the Freedom to Drive purpose. It is possible to do this without commiting any funds or having our logo appear on FTD's press releases. Mack moved, and Beets seconded that: CCCC sign a Freedom to Drive endorsement form but not authorize the use of the CCCC logo in Freedom to Drive promotional materials. The motion passed with 20 in favor, 5 opposed. A copy of the Endorsement Form is to be included with these minutes.



**2020 Air & Ground Show at Rocky Mountain Metro Airport:** RMMA has pulled the plug on the planned major air show due to airfield construction but they are still willing to help CCCC conduct the Swap Meet and Car Show at the airport.


An independent aircraft club known as the Rocky Mountain Renegades is interested in putting on an air show during our event.

CCCC requested a change of date for the event, from August 1 to Aug. 8th The next planning meeting at RMMA is scheduled for January 7, 4 pm, at the airport. We need to avoid losing money as we have in 2018 and 2019. One suggestion is that there we charge perhaps \$5 to enter the car show. Action on this will be tabled until the February meeting.




Make plans to come down on the 18<sup>th</sup> and support our members displays.

## Buying a Used Electric Vehicle by Gordon Kenney

### First Year's Experience with a used electric vehicle

Since 2012 we had been driving "extended range electric vehicles" and while most of our driving was on battery power we had an "on-board" gasoline powered generator to go further than we could on battery alone. But a year ago we purchased a 2015 Tesla Model S-85D. Its specified range was 270 miles and 0-60 mph was 4.4 seconds. Being 4 years old and with 35k miles of use had reduced its price to less than half of what it sold for new but it came with new tires, a 4 year warranty and included no-cost recharging at all of the hundreds of company charger stations.

In the last year we have driven it 12,000 miles with about 4,000 of those in two long distances drives. It has had two recalls (stronger bolts for the BOSH steering rack and a Takata air-bag replacement) and one service item (replacing a circuit board for Internet connection). These were each done at our house by mobile service and we have not gone to the service center itself. We recharge it at home from a 240v circuit (like our dryer) which adds 25 miles of range per hour and we plug it in 2 or 3 times per week. When traveling long distances we recharge every 150 to 200 miles at the company charger stations. The vehicle recently charged to 262 miles compared to its specified 270 mile range when new showing only a 3% loss of range in 4 years and 48,000 miles. The things we like most are the EV driving experience, the very rapid acceleration, the large display screen, frequent over-the-air free updates, service performed at our house and the use of company charging stations when long distance traveling. The freedom of not visiting gas stations and the low cost of "fuel" (less than 4 cents per mile at current electricity rates) are also major pluses.

There are now many new and used EV's available (Jaguar, Audi, M-B, VW, Nisson, GM, Honda, Kia, Tesla, etc.) and prices are getting lower and the capabilities of the cars are getting higher. It is now easy to buy either new or used EV's for less than 40k\$'s.

The Jaguar I-Pace has received excellent reviews and both new and used models are available. A quick search of used models found more than 40 cars with prices in the 60-70k\$ range; most have less than 10,000 miles of use.
