### Learning About Jaguar Legends: XJ40 Series

Being new to the brand, I'm trying to acquaint myself with the long and glorious history of the Jaguar marque. I came across the following article written by **Robert Coucher** of *Octane Magazine* (Issue 185) that profiles the XJ40 program that may aid in the education of other Jag newbies.

"After a lengthy 15-year gestation period, Jaguar launched its all-new XJ, **codename XJ40**, in 1986. The preceding XJ Series III had continued to sell well, contributing to the delay, and when the XJ40

did finally arrive its sharpedged, squared-off styling looked rather less elegant than the sleek shape of the Jaguar it was replacing. Design proposals had been submitted by Pininfarina but it was decided to go with the in-house offering.



ever, the XJ40 ... the last Jaguar created under **Sir William Lyons'** influence ... proved one of the most refined Jaguars ever made, while its handling and performance were a step up from the previous XJ's abilities. It was much cheaper to build than the outgoing XJ, its 25 percent fewer body panels also improving body rigidity and cutting weight. Panel gaps were tighter, reducing drag and wind noise while improving economy. And, inside, was Jaguar's first J-gate transmission selection lever.

The XJ40 saw the introduction of the new AJ6 six-cylinder engine to replace the venerable XK engine that had been in service for 38 years. The AJ6 was offered in 2.9- and 3.6-litre displacements, but in 1990 the 3.6 was replaced by a 4.0 litre unit and the 2.9 by a 3.2. A 6.0 litre V12 was added in 1993. The early multiplex electronics were innovative but unreliable, as was the "Vehicle Condition Monitor' optimistically fitted to early XJ40s. In 1889 it gave way to mechanical gauges. The best XJ40 to buy? Well, apart from an immaculate 4.0, the TWR-tweaked XJR is the one to have."

### **Fall Drive**





#### **JCSC Judges School Minutes**

Jack Humphrey held a zoom Judge's School. In attendance: Jack Humphrey, Rory Andrykowski, Bob Grossman, Frank Oakley, Pete Kulzer, Dwight Eisnach,



Ray Horrell, and Steve Kennedy.

The Judges Meeting for the concours in Colorado Springs will be on the main floor of Thom's Jaguar dealership.

This year cars will be displayed outside the main level. Judging starts at 11 am. Around 4 or 5 pm, we will have a silent auction, awards presentation and dinner. The logistics for dinner are still being worked out.

Three or four days before the event, Jack will send out a list of who is judging which Jaguars.

Judges are expected to bring their own masks to wear, and rule books. Hand sanitizer will also be provided.

Each team chief will have to coordinate how Judges maintain the 6-foot distancing requirement and still accomplish their judging duties. Each team chief will decide when the team can take a break for lunch.

Same admin rules apply as have in the past, make sure everyone fills in all the blanks and make notes for each deduction. Be sure to have a copy of the mandatory deductions readily available in your rule book.

The British Motoring Festival will also be taking place during the concours. They will be located on the ramp up to the service area.

Jack reviewed the 2019 Rule Book Updates with everyone. Any cars that qualify for the S2 Modified class must present the Chief Judge with a list of modifications prior to the concours.

Valve stem caps: 1955 to 1962 will be treated as a transitional period for Jaguars and either domed metal or domed black plastic valve stem caps will be treated as authentic. Green valve stem caps are non-authentic.

Tires do not have to be by a specific manufacturer, but all four road tires must match. If there is a full-size spare, it must also be by the same manufacturer. If it is the space saver tire, it does not have to be by the same manufacturer. For cars that do not have a spare tire, the tire inflation equipment must be present.



Great weather starting at Morrison up to Evergreen for petrol and iced coffee. South to Pine Junction continuing to the South Platte River at Deckers.


