CCCC Meeting Minutes

Senate Bill 22-138 (SB22-138) is a very complex bill aimed at implementing greenhouse gas emissions reductions in Colorado. It puts requirements on insurance companies to add "climate-risk assessments" of investment portfolios, redefines


"agrivoltaics" (yes, that's a new word), eliminates gas-powered lawn mowers etc., provides a credit for purchasers of electrical replacements for gas equipment, and tightens the GHG reduction requirements. And there's more, but nothing aimed at on-road vehicles, old or new. Leo will follow how all this moves forward.

Car Thefts: Car thefts are up 500% in the Denver area and that has included collector vehicles. Owners are advised to park cautiously and consider anti-theft devices. The CCCC trailer (used at the Airport Show) was stolen but has been recovered. It will now have a wireless device added that will detect if it is moved.

Airport Show (August 6 at Rocky Mountain Metro Airport): Dick Thompson urged clubs to consider renting a swap meet space to promote their club and to sell excess parts. Rick Ruel volunteered to coordinate vender sign-ups and locations. There will be an event committee meeting on March 14, 5 pm, at Brothers BBQ, 565 US287 in Broomfield. Parking

2022 Milwaukee AGM

The 2022 AGM was held in Milwaukee, Wisconsin on March 24-27 at the Sonesta Hotel. There were four different museums that we got to visit. We had some time on Friday so we went to the Harley Davidson Museum. They had over 100 vintage Harleys, they even had Harley #1 and a replica of the original 10x12 SHED where it all started. Later that day we went to Mike & Debbie Korneli's home to see their private collection of Jaguars and some other race cars. Mike has a 1934 SS that he is restoring. He also has a beautiful XK 150 and Series 3 E as well as an XK 140 that needs a total restoration. During that visit, Brian Sheridan gave a great presentation. He was on the race team for Tom Walkinshaw's race team back in the '80's. He had been doing some cylinder head building and research. He happened to see an ad for a racing engineer and answered it. He was asked to fly to Chicago. When he got there, they said, "you look great, we are flying to Belgian for a race, get your things." He had lots of other great stories as well.

That evening there was a dinner and dancing at the hotel. Dennis Eynon got to sing along with the band, which everyone thoroughly enjoyed.

Saturday was the AGM. There were lots of reports about the various workings of JCNA. Then we got to the Rule Book. When Hal and I tell people that we are going to a Jaguar Event, people always ask if it is a car show. we say No, it is a Bitch session and everyone is bitching at us. This year was no exception. Well, the world came to a stop. Then, as it usually does, there was a vigorous discussion about having Judges tested every year and requiring Judges to attend a Judges School at least once in their three-year term. "What an imposition to expect Judges to

be aware of current rule changes that may affect how they judge \$100,000 Jaguars". Well, that got shot down. Judging requirements remain at requiring testing once a year and attending a Judge's School only once during each three-year term. There was also a similar discussion about having Chief Judges take a Chief Judge's test with an equal amount of resistance. There have been a number of problems with how scores are reported and which Judges judged which classes. Some reporting shows Judges who judged classes with no cars in them, others show classes that no one judged. The Chief Judge's test will be available for Chief Judges who would like to take it on a trial basis.

That afternoon we got to tour the Wisconsin Auto Museum. They have 25 Kissel Kars (with a K) that were manufactured in Milwaukee, plus many other vintage cars in their museum. And that evening was the Awards Banquet, Yes, Deanie took 2nd in class with a 99.84. Jack Humphrey, Jaguar Club of Colorado Springs, placed 2nd Regional. Jack also accepted the Dealer's Award for the support that the Red Nolan Dealership gives to the Colorado Springs club.

Thank you to the Wisconsin Jaguar Club and John (JCNA President) and Bunni Boswell for hosting the 2022 AGM and to the following sponsors who help make these events possible every year. 


