Cover Photo

This Month's Cover photo is of the gang at the Colorado Rail Road Museum, taken on the back of a Pullman Car with the platform. There were around 25 club members that attended the museum tour.

First we got a tour of the grounds. They have over 100 various rail cars, engines and other rolling stock. There are several steam engines, both standard gauge and narrow gauge. Standard gauge measures 4 foot 8 1/2 inches between the rails. Narrow gauge measures 3 foot between the rails. The main reason for narrow gauge was our mountains and the tight turns required in the mountains. Narrow gauge cars are also smaller. A typical narrow gauge engine is around 9 feet high while an engine like the Big Boy at Foreny's is 16 1/2 inches high.

We also got to see three (#2, #6 and #7) of the original seven Galloping Gooses that the Rio Grand Southern Rail Road ran when there was not enough business to warrant running locomotives in the mountains. They were used mainly for passenger and mail service. Number 1 did not survive and was used for parts to support the other six. A replica has since been built and is on display at the Ridgeway (south of Montrose) museum, where all seven were originally built. Number 3 is at Knott's Berry Farm. Number 4 is located in Telluride. Number 5 is in Dolores, Colorado.

A huge thanks to Steve Parker for setting up this tour and to Deanie for setting up a great lunch at the Table Mountain Inn.

While we were at the Table Mountain Inn, Steve did show a great video narrated by Jaguar Author Nigel Thorley. Nigel covered much of Jaguar's history. If you would like to see it, the link is https://youtu.be/khV3crRejP8

Collector Car Council of Colorado Meeting Minutes

Legislation: HB22-1338 regarding vehicle registration does not appear to threaten collector cars.

Regarding the additional fee added to all registration to cover state park entrances, CCCC cannot obtain a blanket opt-out for collector cars and it will be left for individuals to opt-out on their own. Procedure for opt-outs is not clear at the present time.

Ethanol: Currently E-15 (15% ethanol in gasoline) is authorized but not for use in summer months. In a move to reduce gasoline costs it is proposed to continue its use in summer. This is in conflict with the EPA designation of Colorado being in serious violation of the ozone standard whereby Colorado should reduce the use of ethanol due to its higher volatility. For many collector vehicles ethanol is detrimental to fuel system components.

Airport Show (August 6 at Rocky Mountain Metro Airport): Dick Thompson reported that major sponsors from last year are signed on to support this year's event. Costs such as porta-potties, golf carts, and printing are little changed. We still need volunteers (a club?) to coordinate and handle parking.






