




# **International Jaguar Festival Concours d'Elegance**

**Sunday** there will be a farewell breakfast at the host hotel and other area sight-seeing for those interested.


Our trip home started out in the rain, fortunately it did not rain during the concours. We had rain until we hit the border going into Oklaho-

These days when a docent begins a tour of the Shelby American Collection in North Boulder, he or she will often begin by asking the Question: "Have you seen the movie Ford vs. Ferrari? They do this because they start the tour standing next to the Ford GT40 Mk II that beat Ferrari to win the 1966 24 hours of Le Mans. The GT40 next to it is the car that came in 3rd. A number of RMJC members and a few folks from the Rolls Royce club were treated to this tour on Saturday, Sept. 24th.

Unofficially considered by Shelby aficionados to be the finest collection of Shelby automobiles in the world; the 50 or so Cobras, Shelby Mustangs and Ford GTs housed in the Collection's warehouse represent the entire spectrum of Carrol Shelby's creative work as a racer, builder and designer of high performance automobiles. Although his work is often copied, there are no "re-creation"s or "tribute" cars here. Every car in the collection is the real deal. Most of the

cars are associated with the drivers who competed in them. Names like Ken miles, Dan Gurney, Bob Bondurant, Phil Hill, Peter Brock and Mario Andretti just to name a few.

The history of the Cobra itself begins with the British built AC Bristol, a 2 seat roadster Shelby imported and modified to create his signature car. The collection includes the first 3 cobras ever built; Cobra #1(the only prototype), Cobra #2 (the 1st production Cobra) and Cobra #3 (the 1st racing Cobra also known as the Riverside Car because of it's success on the race tracks in and around Los Angeles and Riverside California in the 1960s).

The Collection is open to the public every Saturday from 10 AM to 4 PM. The cost of admission is \$5.00, the docents are excellent and very knowledgeable and the enlarged time period photos and memorabilia that adorn the walls really enhance the museum experience. If you haven't been there you rally need to go.

Jaguar confirmed that 2024 will be the final model year for the F-type coupe and convertible. Europe is getting a 75th anniversary edition to mark the end of the road, but information about a U.S. special edition isn't available yet.

The F-type first arrived for the 2014 model year and received updates throughout its 10-year run.

Jaguar will soon be without a sports car, as the **F-type** will disappear after the 2024 model year. A 75th anniversary model (pictured at top) has now been released for Europe to commemorate the end of its production run, and a JLR spokesperson confirmed to *C/D* that the 2024 F-type will be the last for the U.S. market as well. We'll likely get some sort of final edition as well, but details aren't available quite yet.
