Meeting was adjourned at 8:30pm





If you ever drop your phone in water, get some of these. They are NOT the same as those silicone bags you get with electronic stuff that you buy,



(MAHWAH, N.J.) – January 28,

2021 – Jaguar Classic is celebrating the 70th anniversary of the legendary C-type sports racer by creating a strictly limited production run of new C-type Continuation cars, which will be hand-built at the world-class Jaguar Land Rover Classic Works facility in Coventry, U.K. The C-type Continuation program will allow toric motorsports enthusiasts to purchase factory-built example of the ultimate 1953 disc-brake-equipped "works" C-type directly from Jaguar, for the first time.

"Driven by some of the most-admired racing drivers in history, the C-type laid foundations for Jaguar's success in endurance racing and is synonymous with sign and engineering innovation," said



Dan Pink, Director, Jaguar Classic. "Seventy years on, Jaguar Classic is proud to be able to utilize the latest innovations in manufacturing technology—alongside traditional skills and unrivalled expertise—to reintroduce this legendary car for a new generation of enthusiasts to enjoy."

Eight C-type Continuation cars will be built ahead of a racing-inspired celebration event for their owners in 2022. Each example will reflect the 1953 Le Mans-winning works team car specification, including a 220 hp 3.4-liter inline-six engine with triple Weber 40DCO3 carburetors and disc brakes. Additional options available to C-type Continuation customers include an FIA-approved Harness Retention System. Not just for show, these C-type models will be eligible for historic racing, track and closed-road use.

Building on the experience gained with previous Jaguar Classic Continuation programs for the Lightweight E-type, XKSS and D-type, Jaguar Classic engineers consulted the Jaguar archives and cross-referenced scan data taken from an original C-type in conjunction with the latest computer aided design (CAD) technology, to create the most authentic new C-type possible. Exclusive access to original engineering drawings and company records created by the original C-type development team—including Malcolm Sayer, competitions manager Lofty England, and engineers William Heynes, Bob Knight and Norman Dewis—ensure the 1953 specifications are accurately maintained.

Taking that engineering CAD data a stage further, Jaguar Classic is also launching <u>a specially designed online configurator</u> to allow enthusiasts to visualize their C-type Continuation virtually. This tool allows users to compare color and trim options from the 12 exterior colors and 8 interior colors available, and apply optional racing roundels, steering wheel badge and hood badging. Enthusiasts can share their favorite C-type Continuation builds using #70YearsofCTYPE for the opportunity to be featured on the @JaguarUSA <u>Instagram</u>, <u>Facebook</u> or <u>Twitter</u>.

The C-type, which was originally produced between 1951 and 1953, was famed for its exceptionally fluid shape by Jaguar Cars designer, aerodynamicist and artist Malcolm Sayer. The C-type won the 24 Hours of Le Mans at its debut in 1951, scoring the first of seven outright wins for Jaguar at the endurance race.

From 1952, the C-type pioneered the adoption of innovative disc brake technology in motorsports with a revolutionary system developed by Jaguar and Dunlop. The C-type scored the first win for a disc brake-equipped car with Stirling Moss at the Reims Grand Prix in France and contesting the Mille Miglia in Italy. The C-type won the 24 Hours of Le Mans again in 1953, and also enjoyed success in the hands of private owners, which contributed to Jaguar finishing vice-champion in the inaugural World Sportscar Championship.

Of the 53 Jaguar C-type sports cars built in the 1950s, 43 were sold to private owners. The production C-type specification was limited to drum-brake-equipped cars with twin SU carburetors and 200 hp, in the style of the 1951 works cars.



SEMA 2022 Report by Vince Lane

This past November 1st, fulfilled a long time wish for RMJC board member Tom Estes and myself as we crossed off a line-item on our respective "bucket lists" as we walked into the massive Las Vegas Convention Center to attend the 2022 SEMA show. Originally the "**Speed** Equipment Manufacturers Association", SEMA was formed in 1963 by Vic Edelbrock, Ed Iskenderian, B&M transmissions, Cragar Wheels, Offenhauser Equipment and others as a means to organize and work together to support the growing aftermarket high performance auto parts industry.

Realizing they could increase business if they all got together in one place and invited their prospective customers to come look; SEMA held its 1st show in 1965 at Dodger's stadium in Los Angeles. They soon outgrew LA and moved to Las Vegas in 1973. The mid-1970s brought government imposed restrictions on emissions, bumpers, etc., and coupled with a 55mph national speed limit caused SEMA to become the "Specialty Equipment Market Association".

No longer open to the public, SEMA is recognized as the largest trade show in Vegas and one of the biggest in the country. Four massive exhibition halls, one of which is 2 stories, display every manner of automotive equipment and accessory plus all the latest trends emerging in the industry. Vendors are grouped together by category. A partial list includes: Global Tire Expo, Wheels & Wheel Accessories, Collision Repair & Refinish, Tools & Equipment, Racing and High Performance, Hot Rod Alley, Restoration Marketplace, Mobile Electronics & Technology, Power Sports & utility Vehicles, Restyling & Car Care Accessories and Trucks, SUVs & Off Road.

Highlights of this year's show included a large separate area identified as "SEMA Electric" featuring many builders specializing in converting your car or truck into a hybrid or full Electric Vehicle. EV Ferraris, Lamborghinis, Porsches, Corvettes, trucks, SUVs and sedans were everywhere throughout the show. "Wraps" have now become extremely popular with many vendors displaying their unique designs on muti-colored Lamborghinis, McClarens, Bugattis etc including a "Mary Kay Pink" Ferrari F40 which we were assured would be peeled back to the original Rosso Corsa after the show.

Other highlights included a huge outdoor area complete with a Toyota sponsored "drift course" where professional drivers in modified Toyota Supras will take you drifting for 2 minutes or so. There was also an underground tunnel system operated by Tesla where you could get in the back of a Tesla model S an be driven underground in a network of one way tunnels to a mid-point drop off or on to the South Hall Lower or up to the West Hall depending on which starting point you chose. The tunnels change color from white to orange to red depending on how close your driver is to the car in front or the next drop off point.

The National Hot Rod Association and the cable TV station MotorTrend were both displayed prominently with the stars of the MotorTrend shows and collector car auctions available for autographs, interviews and the like. Since there are no kids or strollers or dogs, the cars are not roped off and you can walk right

up to every vehicle there. It took us 2 full days to find the 1 and only Jaguar, a modified XK8 used by the villain in 1 of the James Bond movies. It was an ugly green convertible with orange teeth mounted in the grille and a giant gun mounted on the back deck. The folks displaying it borrowed it from the Peterson Museum and were dong a "before and after" on the paint highlighting their line of paint restoration and ceramic coating products.



Although we expected the show to be pretty amazing; it was truly spectacular and even bigger and better than we could have imagined. It took us every bit of 2 full days to cover the grounds and we are still not sure we saw everything. If the CCCC receives an allotment of tickets for next year; I would encourage everyone to sign up. No matter what your pre-conceived notions might be; we assure you that you will not be disappointed.






