This month's cover photo is of Vince and Barb Lane's 1970 Series II E-Type Roadster and was taken at the Roxborough Park Golf Club overlook with the Red Rocks in the background.

The car was purchased from Central Classic Cars in Sylvania, Ohio in August, 2012 after 2 attempts to sell it on EBAY failed. Vince was the high bidder both times but did not meet the reserve. A deal was struck which included a \$10,000 down payment in the form of a 1974 Triumph TR-6 (with overdrive) which Vince shipped to Ohio. The E-Type then came back on the transport.

The car received a major restoration in the fall of 1986 at 85,700 miles including engine and gearbox out, new wiring harness, the current maroon paint and most major components replaced. The odometer now reads 107,420. The car came with a large number of old receipts and the Lane's have made many improvements through the years but the origin of the triple SUs conversion and the covered headlights remain a mystery.

CCCC Minutes

Leo Boyle reported that no bills at the Colorado legislature appear to affect collector cars, either negatively or positively. Senate Bill 23-097 ("Motor Vehicle Theft and Unauthorized Use") deals with the increasing car theft in Colorado and approves increasing consequences for perpetrators, including making it a felony for any value of stolen vehicle. It is expected that there will be a bill dealing with catalytic converter theft but that has not happened yet.

2023 RMMA (Jeffco) Airport Show: Dick Thompson asked that clubs include the August 5th event in their club's calendar of events. If a club wants to be featured in the car show, contact Dick Thompson at 303-929-5533. We need to have more sponsors; Hagerty is no longer sponsoring events such as the Airport Show.


